Letter from the President

As I write this, we are finishing two very busy and productive months since I took over as President of the West Central Neighborhood Association. Here's a brief rundown of what's been happening.

We got OUR parade back! By now, almost everyone knows that the Three Rivers Festival Parade will march down Wayne St. this summer. Parade staging will start on Main, run south down Rockhill to Wayne, and then east through the heart of West Central. Once again, our tree-lined streets will be alive with the sights, sounds and joys of the parade.

The "Space Needle" will not be a part of our neighborhood. As you probably know, Centennial Wireless proposed to build a 150'-tall cell phone tower right in our backyard, partially blocking the historic GE sign. Many residents of West Central appeared at the Board of Zoning Appeals meeting ready to speak up to protect our skyline. I give credit to Centennial for recognizing the sincerity of the opposition and halting the project. The cell phone tower now will be placed elsewhere. I thank everyone there that night. I know many expressed disappointment that their voices were not needed, but a win is a win. And this was a big one.

Work has begun on the Broadway corridor, and we should see the historic lighting and streetscape improvements by this summer.

We are getting more on-street parking. Washington Blvd. should be re-striped this summer with parking allowed on the north side of the street. The Association voted to support the city's proposal for the parking at our February meeting. It was interesting to learn that the present traffic lanes on Washington are wider than those on a U.S. interstate. Because individual parking spaces will not be delineated, we don't know exactly how many spots will be added, but it will be a significant number.

Administratively, Jill Downs, who has been a tremendous asset, decided late last year not to continue as our part-time employee responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Association. She will continue to work for us with a focus on historic preservation as well as with the CHODO project at 1134 Nelson and the annual House and Garden Tour.







The WCNA has a completely remodeled home for sale at 1134 Nelson St. Located on an historic brick street, this charming, gable-front home overlooking Moody Park was rescued by the neighborhood association. With the assistance of the Indiana Association for Community Economic Development and the City of Fort Wayne, the WCNA financed the renovation of this home using a combination of federal funds and a loan from Tower Bank.

Renovation included the removal of asphalt-shingle siding and restoration of the wooden clapboards beneath; the addition of two dormers to increase headroom in the second story; first-floor laundry facilities; a completely new kitchen; a first-floor half-bath; and the creation of a modern interior layout including a full-bath on the second floor. The house also features new windows as well as all-new heating and air-conditioning, plumbing and electrical systems. The large-sized lot allows for plenty of off-street parking. There is room for a garage.

The home is for sale for \$75,000 to an owner/occupant who makes no more than 80% of the Area Median Income, a requirement of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. For Fort Wayne, the income levels are as follows: \$34,350 for a single person; \$39,250 for a family of two; and \$44,150 for a family of three or more.

St. Patrick's Day Celebrated by Firefighters



Grassroots Green Books Available

Grassroots Green is a new, locally based environmental action group founded to educate people about environmental issues and inspire them to work for a more sustainable world. They have produced the *Green Living Guide for Northeast Indiana*. The guide contains information that will help people to learn how to save energy, save money and take better care of our planet. The guide features many money-saving coupons good at many local businesses and organizations. By using the coupons, people who purchase the guide help to strengthen our region's economy.

John Steinbach, the founder of Grassroots Green with his wife Pamela, made a presentation at the March 17 meeting of the West Central Neighborhood Association.

Their guide is designed to be a fund-raising tool for not-for-profit organizations. Their goal is to help other organizations raise \$1,000,000 in 2008. The guide sells for \$15 each, with \$10 of that money going to the participating organization. The West Central Neighborhood Association decided to purchase 20 of the guides. In this way, our \$100 investment will bring us a profit of \$200.


