

Clean Up Set for October 24; Tire Pick Up October 17

The West Central Neighborhood Association has scheduled a neighborhood-wide clean up for October 24, preceded by a tire pick up October 17.

If you have old tires to be recycled, please bring them starting Friday, October 16, to the public parking lot on the southeast corner of Van Buren and Wilt streets. Volunteers will be at the drop off site on Saturday, October 17, beginning at 8:00 am until 11:30 am. All tires must be at the parking lot by 11:30 am.


The city gives the neighborhood association 75 cents for each recycled tire, so this is a great opportunity to clean up the neighborhood as well as earn some money for the association's treasury.

If you know of discarded tires in the neighborhood but are unable to bring them to the drop off site yourself, please report their location by calling David Long at 385-9378 (WEST).

The following Saturday, October 24, the neighborhood will hold a clean up. This year, we will perform the clean up in two parts:

- 1) the city will place a roll-off dumpster in the public parking lot on the southeast corner of Van Buren and Wilt streets by 8:00 am that Saturday morning. The dumpster will then be available until 12:00 noon for neighborhood residents to dispose of large (or small) amounts of trash. Please bring those things not mentioned below that you want to dispose of to the dumpster. Volunteers will be at the site all morning. Following is a list of those items that cannot be placed in the dumpster: anti-freeze, fertilizers, appliances with Freon, fire extinguishers, asphalt, fluorescent bulbs, auto fluids, Freon refrigerant auto parts, hazardous waste, chemicals, herbicides, closed containers, items containing mercury, compressed gas, lead acid batteries, concrete, leaves, explosives, liquids, oil-based paints, pesticides, radioactive materials, special waste, tires and used oil. Latex paint cans need to be dried out before placing in the container. We cannot accept paint in a liquid form as it may leak out onto the ground or street.
- 2) we also have available that weekend a regular, garbage truck. Volunteers from the 13 Step House as well as neighbors will be walking through some of the alleys in the neighborhood that have particularly bad concentrations of trash and debris to clean up those areas. If you know of any large accumulations of trash and debris, please report the location by calling David Long at 385-9378 (WEST), and we will try to ensure we collect from that spot.





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
