West Central Receives Major Accolades

The West Central Neighborhood Association (WCNA) is proud to be the recipient of two major awards this spring: The Downtown Improvement



DID's "Best Event of the Year" for 2009 trophy

District's "Best Event of 2009" for last year's ArtsFest, part of the annual Home & Garden Tour; and "The Best Old House Neighborhood" in Indiana by This Old House magazine.

The first award was presented by the Downtown

Improvement District (DID) at their annual meeting, January 20, 2010. In presenting the award to WCNA, Rich Davis, president of DID, said the award was presented to "West Central Neighborhood Association's ArtsFest for bridging the arts community, downtown residents, and downtown businesses through an expanded two-day block party."

The ArtsFest runs in conjunction with WCNA's annual Home & Garden Tour, which this year will be on September 11 and 12. Last year was the first year that the ArtsFest was expanded to a block party with 13 live bands playing and 28 artists and craftspeople selling their creations on Union Street between Wayne and Berry. DID was the major sponsor of the event.

In addition, West Central was granted national

recognition by *This Old House* magazine, a printed companion to the long-time PBS television show. West Central was named "The Best Old House Neighborhood" in Indiana for 2010. About a year ago, WCNA Treasurer Chris Ruckman found out about the contest and sent information about West Central to the magazine. We narrowly lost the contest in 2009, but *This Old House* re-nominated West Central in 2010, and this year we won.

"We're just honored and thrilled," said Ruckman, who has lived in three different homes in West Central. "It recognizes that West Central is not only a great place to live, but historic homes are surprisingly affordable." The magazine ranked West Central high in categories including Bargains, Cottages and Bungalows, Victorians, and Walkability.

"How cool is that?" said Mike Anderson, former president of the association. "This is a feather in our cap. It is good for downtown Fort Wayne too."

This Old House also mentions West Central's annual Home & Garden Tour & ArtsFest, which attracts thousands, and its designation as a national historic district. The website also refers to WCNA as a "tough-as-nails neighborhood association."

"We've probably got one of the strongest neighborhood associations in the city," Simerman said. "It takes special people to live in an older neighborhood like this."

City Announces Funding Assistance for Down Payment

The City of Fort Wayne has announced a program to assist prospective home buyers with funding for down payments. The funding will come from a pool of \$300,000.

Prospective homeowners must make under 80% or the Area Median Income (for a household of two, the annual income cannot exceed \$40,500). A table showing Area Median Income by Household Size is available on the City of Fort Wayne website, www.cityoffortwayne.org.

"While the market continues to struggle," said Mayor Tom Henry, "Fort Wayne still has an abundance of quality housing available at affordable prices for many of our residents. With the small added boost of down payment assistance, we are investing in our community and bringing more responsible homeowners into our neighborhoods."

The amount of down payment assistance is determined by the requirements of the homebuyer's lender and the location of the home. For most areas in the city, the upper limit is \$5,000 in assistance. For the NSP area, roughly the core of the city (including West Central neighborhood), the upper limit is \$10,000.

Prospective buyers <u>must have a purchase agreement</u> in place to be considered for the down payment assistance program. For information, call 427-1127 and ask to speak with a loan specialist. Loan specialists will work with interested home buyers to help determine eligibility and details of the terms.






Full Text of the Article on West Central from *This Old House*

West Central Neighborhood, Fort Wayne, Indiana

Whether it was the owner of an electric plant, a hardware wholesaler, or the proprietor of a railroad-car works, most of Fort Wayne's early businessmen called West Central

home. From 1830 to the 1950s, they built grand houses in myriad styles, from Federal to Prairie, along the neighborhood's brick-paved streets. While the area fell into decline in the 1960s and '70s, its easy walking distance to a reenergized downtown Fort Wayne is attracting a new generation of residents.

The majority of the statelier homes have been restored, but there are plenty of fixer-uppers still available—mostly sturdy little factory workers' cottages packed with as many details and fine craftsmanship as their larger neighbors.

The Houses

Here you'll find best-of-the-best examples of brick Federals, sprawling Prairies, ample American Foursquares, and Greek Revival cottages, as well as breathtaking examples of Richardsonian Romanesque houses designed by the Indiana-based architectural firm Wing and Mahurin. Homes range from a very affordable \$50,000 to about \$250,000.

Why Buy Now?

The tough-as-nails neighborhood association is vigilant about maintaining West Central's beauty, garnering it a place on the National Register. The association also sponsors an annual home-and-garden tour that attracts thousands. Expansive parks and newly designated bike lanes are getting residents here on a health kick. And downtown Fort Wayne—home to a new minor-league baseball stadium and the beloved Mad Anthony Brewing Company—is just steps away.


