# **Local Historic District Expansion Update**

As reported last fall, the WCNA has begun the process of expanding the West Central Local Historic District. The expansion area is south of West Jefferson Boulevardd between Broadway and the Penn Central Railroad, Broadway from the Penn Central Railroad to almost Main Street, and West Wayne and Berry Streets Between Broadway and Webster Streets.

Informational meetings were held in September and October 2004, and information packets and

signature cards were mailed to many affected property owners. Other property owners have been and are being contacted on an individual basis. The process is slow, but is moving along. We need 51% of affected property owners to sign in favor of the expansion in order to proceed with the next step in the process.

# Swinney Park Pedestrian Bridge over the St. Mary's River

In 2002, LANDSCAPES, Inc. completed a Cultural Landscape Report for Swinney Park that made recommendations for improvements in the park. Recognizing that there are both money and resource limitations to take into consideration in regard to the overall Master Plan for Fort Wayne's park system, the WCNA Parks Committee developed its own goals as a commitment toward making the suggested improvements happen. Some of our short term and on-going volunteer projects include participating in the annual The Great Tree Canopy Comeback, a project to reforest the park, and clearing undesirable vegetation in the Junk Ditch area.

The WCNA Parks Committee's intermediate goals category includes rehabilitation of the pond, picnic pavilion and the construction of a pedestrian

bridge across the St. Mary's River to connect East and West Swinney Park. Early in 2004, the WCNA applied for and received Community Development Block Grant funding to study the feasibility of the bridge. The study, completed in December 2004, evaluates crossing locations, structure options, connectivity with the Fort Wayne Greenway trail system, safety, aesthetics, maintenance issues and construction costs. In the near future, the WCNA will be meeting with various Swinney Park interest groups to review the results of the study and to choose an option to work toward funding.

# Help Available for Claiming Earned Income Tax Credit

Fort Wayne Mayor Graham Richard has initiated the third annual "Money in Your Pocket" campaign designed to help low-income residents claim the Earned Income Tax Credit on their 2004 tax returns. Households with 2 or more children and a family income of less than \$35, 484 can get up to \$4,300 in refunds, and households with no children and income of less than \$12, 490 may get up to \$390. In the West Central neighborhood, tax preparation help is available at the Benito Juarez Center, 1210 Broadway, on Thursdays from 6pm to 8pm and Saturdays from 9am to 1pm. Help also is available at other sites around Fort Wayne. Call the Mayor's office at 427-1111 for more information.

# **Historic Preservation Lecture Series**

ARCH, Inc., Fort Wayne's historic preservation organization, is hosting a "Free & Easy Lecture Series" this spring. Two lectures remain on the schedule.

On March 10 at 7:00 pm at the Pontiac Library 2215 Hanna Street, David Duvall, Indiana State Architect with the Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology, will present "Tax Incentives for Historic Preservation." This lecture will discuss the tax credits available toward the rehabilitation of both commercial and residential historic properties. Properties either on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, including those in historic districts, and/or the Indiana Register of Historic Sites and Structures may qualify. Anyone planning to undertake a substantial rehabilitation project of a house or other structure is encouraged to attend this informative lecture.

On April 20, 7:00 pm at the Shawnee Library 5600 Noll Avenue, Don Orban, Preservation Planner with the City of Fort Wayne, will present "Hues & Clues: Picking the Right Paint for the Right Architectural Style."



# WCNA House and Garden Tour plans beginning to take shape


