- Michael Keefe of Verizon presented information on FiOS TV which will be coming soon to the West Central Neighborhood
- Packages will include speeds starting at 5mbps and ranging up to 30mbps
- Will transmit at 2mb faster than DSL
- The all digital signal FiOS TV capability will be launching this summer

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1134 Nelson Street
 - Tower Bank is in process of \$53,000 commitment to WCNA
 - Contractors need to be contacted for bids on work
 - City Code was complaining about the house

- CEDIT 2007 Dollars
 - Suggestion is to extend street light improvements to Washington Boulevard
- CEDIT 2008 Dollars
 - Requests are due in March
 - CEDIT needs to be spent on infrastructure
 - Continue ongoing request for brick street repair
 - Request trash cans for Moody Park (who would empty)
 - Decision was made to ask for all projects and see what is approved
 - Potential funding of \$24,000 from City Councilman Tim Pape
 - Additional funding of \$125,000 from Council at Large
- Other
 - 901 W. Washington Blvd.
 - With over 50% destroyed owner must revamp entire building
 - Owner has one year to restore building
 - Option may be to use public nuisance law

NEW BUSINESS

- Washington School
 - Research possibility of using as retail business location
 - Possible art studios
- Discussion as to light pollution and noise pollution
