- Downtown Parking Study
- Goals and ways to improve downtown parking
 - Improvement wayfinding
 - Multi-modal improvements
 - Management and administration
 - Demand-Based Pricing
 - People are parking in West Central because it's free parking, whereas if you go 2 blocks closer to downtown, it's \$1 per hour with a 2 hour maximum
 - Perhaps we can unlock some of the downtown parking make the price more attuned to where the demand is
 - They don't plan to put meters in residential areas
 - Connectivity
 - Improve sidewalk quality
 - Help connect across train tracks

- Goals for 2019
 - o Put together a meaningful brick alley repair program

 - Complete the local historic district expansion

- Implement a beautification program for exterior of homes using grant money and WCNA money
- Investigate the possibility of hiring an employee who would write grants and serve the association board
- WCNA Signage Plan
 - We were awarded a matching grant from the City for \$5,000 to create and implement 70 signs throughout the neighborhood
 - This came from a pool of \$40,000 (maximum individual grant of \$5,000)
 - The signs would be ordered from Indiana Signworks, and would cost approximately \$130 each and include the bracket
 - They're 14"x14" each
 - Screen-printed aluminum
 - They would be at least 9' above the ground
 - They would fit on both the taller lampposts and shorter ones no drilling necessary
 - The goal is to connect areas 1-5
 - The City's \$5,000 must be used south of Jefferson, but we can use our \$5,000 wherever we'd like
 - o The board has approved this plan
 - There were some questions from the association about the 14"x14" size, and wondering if we could make it bigger
 - Tyler has a meeting with the city in 2 weeks, and will clarify the plans for installation and the cost of that
 - o Motion to budget \$5,000 for the project, with the understanding that we will view a mockup and vote again on the size/design of the actual sign
 - Unanimously approved
